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ix Regular monitoring of ground water level and quality shall be carried out by, establishing network of existing wells and construction new Piezometers. The monitoring for quantity shall be done four times in a year - premonsoon monsoon (August), postmonsoon (November) and winter (January) seasons and for quality in May. Data thus collected should be submitted the to Ministry of Environment & Forests and to the Pollution Central Control Board quarterly within one month of monitoring. The quality of groundwater shall be randomly got analyzed through laborites recognized under the EPA Rules 1986.

Monitoring of ground water level in core and buffer zone is carried out four times in a year and water quality analysis is done once in a year by establishing a network of the existing wells. Additionally, two nos. of the piezometers are fitted with Digital Water Level recorder with and without telemetry system (deep and shallow) are in operation to monitor the impact of mining on ground water level in core zone. Moreover, quality of ground water is being monitored by NABL accredited lab on fortnightly basis. A copy of the report is attached and is regularly submitted to RO, MOEF&CC and MPCB Office.

CMPDIL is carrying out well water level monitoring in every quarter and no adverse report is there.

Mine is closed since June 2017 and monitoring is going to be closed in next year.

The company shall put up artificial groundwater recharge measures for augmentation of groundwater resource in case monitoring indicates a decline in water table. The project authorities should meet water requirement of nearby village (s) in case the village wells go dry due to dewatering of mine.
